BURNING IS AUTHORIZED SUBJECT TO THE FOLLOWING CONDITIONS

Materials burned under an agricultural permit are limited to bona fide agricultural waste. Agricultural waste is material generated by an agricultural operation that uses, or intends to use, land primarily for the purpose of obtaining a profit in money by raising, harvesting and selling crops or raising and selling livestock (including poultry) or the produce thereof.

1. Pacific County Fire District No. 1 must be notified at the start of every burn operation before the fire is ignited. Please call 665-4451 to determine if it is a burn day, and to provide permit number and location of burn. Please call 24 hours in advance for an initial site inspection.
2. The fire may contain only agricultural waste in piles not to exceed 10' x 10' x 10'.
3. Burn no more than one (1) pile at any one time. No fire shall be commenced before 7 a.m. and no material shall be added to the fire after sunset.
4. A firebreak fifteen (15) feet wide, to bare soil, must be constructed around the pile to be burned before igniting.
5. Fires are not permitted within 100 feet of any structure or 150 feet from a wood shake roof.
6. Fires are not permitted within 50 feet of standing timber and within 500 feet from forest slash.
7. Do not burn if the wind is blowing more than fifteen (15) miles per hour from any direction.
8. Material to be burned shall be free of chemical residue (i.e. pesticides and/or herbicides), garage, plastic, wire insulation, automobile parts, asphalt, petroleum products, petroleum treated materials, rubber products, animal remains or animal byproducts, and or any material which normally emits dense smoke or noxious odors.
9. Burning of material transported from another location is prohibited.
10. Provide a minimum of one (1) person in attendance at the fire while burning. The fire shall not be left unattended until it is extinguished and cold to touch. Burying the burn pile with dirt does not constitute extinguishment.
11. When requested by Fire District personnel, applicant shall provide on site water as directed.

13. Field burning: All relevant fire hazard factors should be considered, and all safety practices and rules should be observed. All reasonable precautions should be undertaken to prevent wildfire, excessive smoke, and nuisance to neighbors.

This permit may be cancelled and/or the fire extinguished by Pacific County Fire District No. 1 when deemed to be a nuisance and/or necessary for the protection of life or property.

I have read and understand the requirements of this permit. If I do not abide by these rules, I understand I will be liable for costs incurred by the fire protection authority called to respond to, control, or extinguish an illegal or out of control fire pursuant to WAC 173-430.
