1. Policy 105 – Electronic and Digital Signatures

Commissioner Downer made a motion to Policy 105 – Electronic and Digital Signatures, seconded by Commissioner Long.

Commissioner Long stated that the policy listed various vendors to use for electronic signatures.

Commissioner Downer added that Brian Snure had stated that each agency would need to specify which vendor would be used.

Commissioner Long suggested that the policy be amended to approve electronic signatures via Adobe only.

Commissioner Hill stated that the motion has died for the policy being approved as written.

Commissioner Downer made a motion to Policy 105 – Electronic and Digital Signatures as amended per Commissioner Long's recommendation, seconded by Commissioner Long. Motion carried.

2. Springbrook Subscription Renewal


Commissioner Long made a motion to approve the Springbrook Subscription Renewal, seconded by Commissioner Downer. Motion carried.

3. 2021-2022 Collective Bargaining Agreement between PCFD1 and IAFF Local 3999

Commissioner Downer stated that he had found some small housekeeping items that needed to be cleaned up. Commissioner Long agreed.

Chief Brundage informed that this copy of the agreement has been updated with current changes. He stated that he would like to discuss those changed in executive session and hoped to have an action after the session.

Commissioner Hill stated that the 2021-2022 CBA has been tabled until after executive session.





4. Ambulance Remount/Rechassis

Commissioner Long made a motion to approve purchase of the ambulance remount as presented, seconded by Commissioner Downer. Motion carried.

5. Purchase Pelican Cases for Medication and Airway Boxes

Commissioner Downer stated that he would like an explanation reviewing the pros and cons of approving this business item.

AC Bishop explained that the current bags are cloth, and they are worn out. They are also a health and safety concern; when they are contaminated with blood and vomit, they must be dumped out and washed. They are also at capacity. These cases provide a lifetime warranty. They are lightweight, and they protect our supplied in hard, plastic cases. Also, the meds cannot roll around inside of these cases. I would recommend this product based on the durability, cleanliness, ease of use, and the lifetime warranty.

Commissioner Long made a motion to approve the purchase of Pelican Cases for medication and airway boxes, seconded by Commissioner Downer. Motion carried.

6. Purchase Handtevy Pediatric Emergency Standards System

Commissioner Long made a motion to approve the purchase of the Handtevy Pediatric Emergency Standards System as presented, seconded by Commissioner Downer. Motion carried.

7. Purchase 2 Binder Lift Bariatric Seats

Commissioner Downer asked if these were seats which could be used from bed to gurney.

AC Bishop stated that most of our on-the-job injuries are back strains from lifting patients off of the floor. Public Assists comprise 10% of our call volume.


Commissioner Downer questioned if this device will help these calls.

AC Bishop affirmed that it would. He also added that it stores and cleans easily. Our goal with this equipment is to help prevent back injuries.

Commissioner Downer made a motion to approve the purchase of 2 Binder Lift bariatric seats, seconded by Commissioner Long. Motion carried.

8. Purchase 20 Online/Textbook Packages for EMT Course

Commissioner Downer asked how much of this purchase would be reimbursed by the SAFER grant.





Chief Brundage stated that it would pay for 100% of this cost for our members; the other departments will be billed \$1,200 per student to cover their costs.

Commissioner Downer asked if the excess books could be used for the next EMT class.

AC Bishop stated that they could, or they could be returned for a refund.

Commissioner Downer made a motion to approve the purchase of online portion and textbooks for the 2021 EMT Course, seconded by Commissioner Long. Motion carried.

9. Purchase Vacuum Mattresses for Ambulances

Commissioner Long made a motion to approve the purchase of vacuum mattresses for ambulances, seconded by Commissioner Downer. Motion carried.

10. Purchase iPad Air 4s for Mobile Data Computers

Commissioner Downer asked if these iPads are currently available.

AC Bishop stated that they are; he spoke directly to Verizon to obtain quotes.

Commissioner Downer asked if they are the newest models and would work well for our needs.

AC Bishop confirmed that they are the latest model and would work well as MDCs in the apparatus.

Commissioner Downer made a motion to approve the purchase of iPad Airs to act as Mobile Data Computers, seconded by Commissioner Long. Motion carried.

District Chief's Report: See Attached Report

- AC Weatherby's Report AC Weatherby reported the following: 1.
 - a. The two new FF/PMs moving forward; their drug checks, backgrounds, and physicals have been completed.
 - b. We are currently trialing firefighter gear. We are looking to purchase four sets; he stated that he will bring his recommendation back to the Board.
 - c. The officer's testing was competitive, and there are good candidates.
 - d. He spoke with Joel Strange from Garages R Us. The garage doors for the Seaview Station should be received by Christmas.
 - e. When lighting around the station is going out, he informed he is replacing bulbs with LED lighting.
 - f. Sid's Market is currently having an issue with fire codes; the District is currently working with the property owners and DCD to help resolve issues.



- 2. AC Bishop's Report AC Bishop reported that he is working on an audit for the health & safety and HIPAA procedures. His goal is to bring them to Chief and possibly the Board in January.
- 3. Pub Ed Coordinator Karvia's report See attached report. She also added that Toys for Peninsula Kids will be held on Saturday, and the public has been extremely generous this year.

Commissioner Hill established that a quorum was present and called the meeting to order at 16:02 hours. The meeting was held via Zoom. Attendance at the meeting included the following District members:

New Business:

1. Collective Bargaining Agreement between PCFD1 and IAFF Local 3999

Commissioner Hill stated that the purpose of this meeting is to ratify the contract.

Chief Brundage informed that the union has agreed to the contract that was sent to the Board. He added that he is excited to move forward with a new year and a new contract. The contract was approved by counsel; most changes were grammatical.

Commissioner Downer made a motion to approve the Collective Bargaining Agreement between PCFD1 and IAFF Local 3999, seconded by Commissioner Long.

Discussion ensued.

Commissioner Downer questioned Article 18.2 regarding expanding vacation hours/leave time. He didn't recall seeing this section in the prior copy of the contract. He asked if this would cause a scheduling problem.

Chief Brundage stated that negotiated vacation accruals are part of the firefighters' compensation package. Currently, if they hit 336 vacation hours, they either lose leave or it can be converted to sick leave. The issue is that the union would like to cashout the excess vacation accrual if they are not able to use it.

Commissioner Downer asked if all leave was rolled into one paid time off.

Chief Brundage affirmed that it does not.

Commissioner Downer asked if it was on top of sick leave.

Chief Brundage stated that vacation is an earned benefit. Sick is not necessary beyond what is required by law. Vacation is separate. If the employee separates employment at PCFD1, they are able to get an hour-per-hour cashout.

Commissioner Long stated that vacation is mental health time. He expressed his concern for using vacation accrual as a bank rather than for rest.

Chief Brundage stated that he had brought this argument up during negotiations. One year ago, the union members were burned out. They now argue that with the mandatory on-call days gone, they can detach on those non-required days. Derrey had stated that there are union members who are losing this benefit. Haldeman, for one, doesn't call in sick or abuse his leave, and he loses his vacation leave.

Commissioner Long stated that he will go with this article, but it concerned him that people could stockpile leave. He asked that it be monitored.

Chief Brundage understood the concern.

Commissioner Downer added that he agrees with Commissioner Long's sentiment; people need down time to reenergize.

Motion carried.

Chief Brundage thanked the Board for the approval. He stated that it will be good to move forward, and believes that this CBA will provide a good framework and will help build a good labor/management relationship. 2021 from a labor/management perspective looks good.

Commissioner Long added that his is looking forward to good communication with the professionals in 2021.

2. Firefighter Property Program Acquisition

Chief Brundage informed that the state has contacted our District regarding a 5-ton that is available through DNR's Firefighter Property Program. Mechanic Hersey and AC Weatherby will go up to JBLM next Tuesday to see if this one works. This acquisition will allow us to update our brush truck at the other station. There will be no cost other than fetching the apparatus; this is a pass-through grant.

Executive Session: None

Commissioner Hill thanked everyone and wished them a Happy New Year. He added that he is looking forward to 2021 with the new contract.

Meeting adjourned at 16:46.

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

THIS AGREEMENT is made effective January 1, 2021 by and between Wellspring Family Services Employee Assistance Program, d.b.a. Wellspring EAP (the "Agency") who will provide a professional Employee Assistance Program (the "Program") for all benefits eligible employees of Pacific County Fire District 1 (the "Employer"). This program is designed as an assessment and referral benefit for Employer's benefits eligible employees and their benefits eligible family members ("Clients").

WHEREAS, the parties entered into that certain agreement for the provision of employee assistance program services dated January 1, 2001 (the "EAP Agreement") and to remain in effect unless terminated in accordance with its provisions.

NOW THEREFORE, for good and valuable consideration paid by each of the parties hereto to the other, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, the parties agree as follows:

- The Employer shall reimburse the Agency for services performed at the rate indicated in Schedule 1. Payment of
 fees are due within thirty (30) days of billing and a finance charge will accrue on the unpaid balance at a rate of
 one percent (1%) per month, commencing thirty (30) days after billing. Rates are guaranteed through
 December 31, 2021. Rates may be changed by the Agency through written notice delivered to Employer thirty
 (30) days prior to the effective date of price increase.
- 2. Except as set forth in this Agreement to Renew, the EAP Agreement is unmodified. This Agreement may be executed in any number of counterparts, each of which shall be an original; but such counterparts shall together constitute but one and the same instrument.

EMS Division Budget Proposal

Project: Replace outdated cardiac monitors.

Recommendation:

 Purchase 6 Zoll X Series Advanced cardiac monitors for 5 ambulances and 1 command rig.

Justification/Need/Rationale:

- Cardiac monitors are used by all providers daily on almost every call, perform cardiac monitoring, defibrillation, pacing, blood pressures, pulse oximetry, carbon dioxide and carbon monoxide monitoring.
- Reduce risk and liability of a monitor failure and increase patient safety.
- We are in a position of immediate replacement, regardless of device.
- Current LifePak 15s are Versions 1 or 2, dated 2010 or 2011, and not supported by manufacturer after 8 years (2018). Their current Version 4 will also not be supported past 8 years, including our AEDs.
- Zoll X Series are clinically superior, lighter weight, and smaller.
- Zoll monitors do not have a wear out date and software is updated using a thumb drive for free by us, including their AEDs.
- Zoll is including \$8,000 worth of expendable supplies for free.
- Current devices do not have modems to transmit data to software for patient care reporting and continuous quality improvement functions.
- Need for a CPR compression device to eliminate the need of multiple responders to perform chest compressions, decrease risk, and increase survival, especially with decreased staffing and transporting the patient.
 Zoll is including an AutoPulse for free.
- Need for modem capability to transmit data for care to ER and conduct continuous quality improvement. Zoll provides this for free.

Cost Comparison:

- Zoll X Series Advanced, Case Review software, Service Contracts (\$1530/yr), Modems, Battery Support system, AutoPulse CPR device: \$228,578.16, with payment options of \$7446 for 36 months, \$5584 for 48 months, or \$4467 for 60 months.
- LifePak 15, Code Stat software, Service Contracts (\$16,320.14/yr), Modems, Lucas CPR device: \$187,562.36, with payment options of 0% down and 3 years payment plans.
- The difference of \$41,015.80 will be pay itself off without the need to replace durable equipment every 8 years.
- Request competitive bidding exemption per RCW 39.04.280 in that they are a single source of supply and a purchase in the event of an emergency. The emergency is a threat to the proper performance of essential functions.

RCW 39.04.280

Competitive bidding requirements—Exemptions.

This section provides uniform exemptions to competitive bidding requirements utilized by municipalities when awarding contracts for public works and contracts for purchases. The statutes governing a specific type of municipality may also include other exemptions from competitive bidding requirements. The purpose of this section is to supplement and not to limit the current powers of any municipality to provide exemptions from competitive bidding requirements.

- (1) Competitive bidding requirements may be waived by the governing body of the municipality for:
- (a) Purchases that are clearly and legitimately limited to a single source of supply;
- (b) Purchases involving special facilities or market conditions;
- (c) Purchases in the event of an emergency;
- (d) Purchases of insurance or bonds; and
- (e) Public works in the event of an emergency.
- (2)(a) The waiver of competitive bidding requirements under subsection (1) of this section may be by resolution or by the terms of written policies adopted by the municipality, at the option of the governing body of the municipality. If the governing body elects to waive competitive bidding requirements by the terms of written policies adopted by the municipality, immediately after the award of any contract, the contract and the factual basis for the exception must be recorded and open to public inspection.

If a resolution is adopted by a governing body to waive competitive bidding requirements under (b) of this subsection, the resolution must recite the factual basis for the exception. This subsection (2)(a) does not apply in the event of an emergency.

- (b) If an emergency exists, the person or persons designated by the governing body of the municipality to act in the event of an emergency may declare an emergency situation exists, waive competitive bidding requirements, and award all necessary contracts on behalf of the municipality to address the emergency situation. If a contract is awarded without competitive bidding due to an emergency, a written finding of the existence of an emergency must be made by the governing body or its designee and duly entered of record no later than two weeks following the award of the contract.
- (3) For purposes of this section "emergency" means unforeseen circumstances beyond the control of the municipality that either: (a) Present a real, immediate threat to the proper performance of essential functions; or (b) will likely result in material loss or damage to property, bodily injury, or loss of life if immediate action is not taken.

The one I did not change is Case Review Premium. It is not a software license that gets installed on one computer. It is a loud based sas (software as a solution) So you are paying for cloud storage. This program is absolute game changer for agencies that use it. I can't recommend it enough.

I already gave you a break on it, and put 5 instead of 6, but the number will go in all 6 monitors, I just thought 1 would not get used as much, so it would not use as much cloud storage. It works out to \$495/monitor/yr. This can be paid annually.

We start with a zoom training, then our clinical success team takes over, and once a month for a year, they do training with you, or your QA/QI person once a month for a year. This really is the kind of thing that takes an agency and provider to a different level.

If you want to add it later I do understand and will take if off the quote. I just think this is the kind of thing that you are aiming for as Chief, and moving the agency forward.

PCFD1 has received four (4) sets of turn out gear to "wear test."


Honeywell "Edge," Honeywell "Viper," Innotex "Energy," and Lion "Pacific." PCFD1 has hosted 3 sales representatives to evaluate gear.


One of the issues raised was the presence of PFAS chemical used in the manufacture of gear, similar to the chemical is AFFF foam. It has been linked to firefighter cancers in a study by Dr. Peaslee at Notre Dame. The C8 polymer has been phased out in the waterproofing moisture barrier. It was replaced by a short chain version of the polymer using C6 technology. In January of 2021, a PFZero outer shell fabric was released. PFZero is similar in price with the Armor AP that we currently use.

Capt. Haldeman and I have considered the research and believe that a PFZero fabric is the best option for our turn out gear ensemble. This will help reduce firefighter exposure to carcinogens found in our PPE.

The BOC will be provided with quotes and a recommendation for turn out gear at the next meeting.

1. Seaview garage doors


The replacement doors have been installed in the old building replacing the wooden doors. Garages R Us Joel Strange reported that three of the panels had damage from the factory and that replacements have been ordered. The damage is not noticeable and the doors are working properly. He will replace the damaged panels when they come in.

2. Training

- a. The United Methodist Camp in Ocean Park has donated two structures for training and to burn later this year. Capt. DeConto and I have constructed some additional spaces in the building and they are being utilized for "cold drills". Currently we are performing search and rescue, ladder deployment and hose advancement training nearly daily.
- b. PCFD1 hosted a EV vehicle class on Jan. 16th. This course familiarized responders to the new electrical systems used in modern cars. The course was well received and attended.
- c. I am signed up and taking the IFSAC Fire Inspector I course in February. Voluntary Company Level Inspections were identified in the WSRB report as a major component where we could improve our score.


3. Turn Out Gear Replacement

1. Personnel Information
