TESTING PROCESS;

The testing process consists of steps to ensure a candidate is capable of performing the job as a Paramedic. The testing process is comprised of an application review, skill assessment, oralinterview, and Chief's interview.

Application Review

All applications will be reviewed and ranked based on EMS length of service and certifications. Applications shall be complete and thorough. Submitted applications will be used to determine if the candidates meet the minimum qualifications, prior to continuing with the testing process. Failure to submit a completed application packet, and / or falsification of information may result in an immediate disqualification from continuing in the testing process.

Completed applications shall include the following:

- Experience Document experience including internships, do not include partial years
- Certifications –Washington State Paramedic certification, NREMT certification, NIMS
 certification, AHA certifications, NAEMT certifications, EMS certification, Washington

- Education Copies of Associate's Degrees and Bachelor's Degrees in related or unrelated fields

Oral Interview

The oral interview measures the candidate's ability to interact with others, deal with certain situations, and demonstrate personal characteristic or traits.

Skills Assessment

The skills assessment measures the candidate's ability to perform medical care and interact with patients.

Chief's Interview

The Fire Chief will interview final candidates for open positions.
